- The PTP program was established by the Kiwanis Cal-Nev-Ha Foundation in 1994
- Contributions received for PTP provide grants to clubs for PTP projects and are used to support our Partner Hospitals
- There are currently six Partner Hospitals in the Cal-Nev-Ha District

 - *Children's Hospital and Research Center at Oakland*
 - *Children's Hospital Central California*
 - *Loma Linda University Children's Hospital*
 - *Kapi'olani Medical Center for Women and Children*
 - *Washoe Medical Center*
- CMN was founded in 1983 by the Osmond Foundation
- Kiwanis International was one of the founding sponsors and continues to sponsor CMN today
- 100 percent of every dollar raised in a community stays there to help children served by participating CMN hospitals in the local area
- CMN hospitals treat all children regardless of affliction or the family's ability to pay
